

Tiger Advancement Ceremony

CM: Tonight we are honoring some Cub Scouts who have reached a new rank. They have worked hard to earn the sign of the Tiger. Would the following Scouts and their parent please come forward.

(Read Scouts names)

CM: Do you want to wear the sign of the Tiger? If you do, please say "yes".

Tigers: Yes

CM: We will give you the sign of the Tiger which will start you on your journey along the Scouting Trail. You will need lots of support from your family as you try to attain Cub Scouting's highest honor, the Arrow of Light.

CM: The blue is from the sky. The blue on your forehead is to remind you to do your best on the Cub Scout Trail. (Paint a small circle and 3 dots on his forehead.)

CM: The yellow is from the sun. The yellow marks under your eyes will help you see the light of the Cub Scout Trail, and symbolize the bright spirit of Cub Scouting. (Paint a yellow U under each eye.)

CM: The red mark on your chin stands for fire so that you have a burning desire to explore new areas. (Paint a vertical stripe on his chin.)

Tiger Cubs, remember the meaning of your Tiger paint. It shows that you are ready to move along the trail of Scouting.

Your den leader will now present your Tiger Partners with your Tiger Badge. Your parents will present you with your badge.

Now we will hand you your parent's pin to present to your parent who has helped you on your trail.
